# FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (C) 10 JULY 2022

**Dear Parishioners** 

The Jews of the Old Covenant had established a system of more than five hundred commandments and prohibitions, which was to allow them to do God's will in everything, because they no longer had a clear vision of what was absolutely essential to their eyes. For lawyers, discussing hierarchies and commandments was often far more important than institutions designed to truly do God's will.

This is demonstrated by the example of the lawyer who tries to taste Jesus by asking a question about who his neighbour is, But Jesus forces the doctor of the law to give the right answer for himself and then shows him which neighbour is to love as himself: he is the one who is in poverty and needs our help.

He goes even further, showing that a Samaritan to be despised (in the eyes of the doctors of the law) is capable of doing good in a natural way by following the voice of his heart, the hated enemy proved himself to be the compassionate neighbour. while two pious Jews are disinterested in an unbecoming way. It is not social definitions such as class, religion, gender, or ethnicity that determines who is our neighbour. A person who acts with compassion and love toward another is a true neighbour.

We all know, that at any time, but especially in this challenging time we ought to not only identify our neighbours but extend our helping hands to them in any way possible.

### **TODAY'S READINGS** -

Deuteronomy 30:10-14, Colossians 1:15-20, Luke 10:25-37

#### **SCRIPTURE REFLECTION**

To many a Jew at the time of Jesus the hatred of the Samaritans was such that a Good Samaritan was a contradiction in terms. It is striking that Luke changes the dialogue about the two commandments. In Mark's and Matthew's accounts Jesus answers the question about the commandments, while in Luke Jesus challenges the questioner, who then himself gives the right answer. It is also striking that, in his reply at the very end, the lawyer, despite Jesus' praise of him, cannot bring himself to pronounce the hated name, 'Samaritan', and says 'the one who...'. The conscientious dilemma of the priest and the Levite reveals a dry humour within this story: if the huddled traveller turns out to be dead, they will incur corpse-defilement and be unable to perform their sacred duties! This legal difficulty makes the Samaritan's attentive generosity all the more poignant, for a Samaritan is free of any such hang-ups. Love shown to the unfortunate and the down-trodden is a major theme in Luke's Gospel. But note also the Samaritan's careful administration of his funds: he gives not a blank cheque but two days' wages, which he will supplement on his return if necessary!

What is the main point of Jesus' story? Is it to be generous or not to bejudgmental?Dom Henry Wansbrough OSB
