TODAY'S READINGS -

Wisdom 11:22-12.2, 2 Thessalonians 1:11-2.2, Luke 19:1-10

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Zacchaeus was a Jew, made wealthy by collecting taxes for the Romans. He was doubly despised by his countrymen for being part of a dishonest profession and for consorting with the enemy. However, he was also one of many people who wanted to see Jesus. He was too unpopular and unimportant to be allowed a place at the front of the crowd and too short to see over their heads, so he climbed a tree. He didn't expect to be noticed, he was just curious about the appearance of a famously holy man; someone with a reputation diametrically opposite to his own. He was as surprised as everyone else when Jesus called him down and he was filled with joy. Everyone else was disgusted. They (as might we) could not understand why a man of God should want to spend time in the company of such an obviously disreputable character. Surely, such a sinner should be rejected and condemned? Zacchaeus welcomed Jesus joyfully, showing his repentance by promising to share half his riches with the poor and recompensing fourfold any whom he had wronged. He was overjoyed, because the call of Jesus told him that God still loved him. In that moment he realised that true wealth was to be close to God, doing God's will, including caring about the very people from whom he had been taking money. Jesus again reminds us that He came to call back those who have lost sight of God's love. We are all children of Abraham in faith, called to repent and believe in the gospel, trusting in the unfailing love of God. PB


