Fr Patrick Aikens RIP 1937-2023

It is with great sadness that we received the news this week that Fr Patrick died unexpectedly at his home in Dublin at the age of 86.

Fr Patrick was born in Dublin in 1937, and after a professional career with Rank Xerox, trained for the priesthood for the Archdiocese of Southwark at All Hallows College, and was ordained priest in 1969. His first assignment was to the team of clergy at St George's Cathedral, where he became Master of Music.

In the Autumn of 1978, he arrived in Forest Hill as assistant priest to Fr Jack Pledger. Due to the parish priest's ill-health, he was appointed vicar coadjutor within a few years, and after Fr Jack's death in 1983, he was appointed to succeed him as parish priest – an unusual move in those days. He retired to his hometown of Dublin in 2008, after thirty years' ministry in this Parish.

Fr Patrick had a profound impact on the life of our parish and of so many people who experienced his ministry. He was passionate about involving as many people as possible in every aspect of parish life, and there was a huge expansion of all sorts of

groups in the parish. His belief in the Conciliar teaching that the liturgy, and particularly the eucharist, were both the source and summit of Christian life, led him to encourage parishioners to understand the liturgy and improve participation in it. He encouraged the formation of the art group, a new music group at a second Sunday Mass, congregational singing, and initiated the Family Mass. Catechesis for Reconciliation, Eucharist and Confirmation was brought from the school into the parish, and 'Instruction' made way for 'Journey in Faith', all with the resultant increase in the number of parish catechists. Organisation, training and rotas for servers, readers and extraordinary ministers of holy communion followed. Wider groups included the founding a youth club, the justice and peace group and humouring the parish drama group.

Masterminding the re-ordering of the Church was a major milestone in Fr Patrick's ministry, creating the halls, meeting room and facilities which a busy parish desperately needed. The re-ordered interior of the Church not only brought members of the community closer to the altar, but the community involvement in the building work brought us closer together as a community.

Fr Patrick articulated and lived a consistent and clear vision of a loving, supportive and welcoming community, sharing its resources and living in the love of Christ. He was much inspired by the life and work of the Taizé community in France, which he visited most years and to which he introduced many parishioners, including a parish pilgrimage in 1986. He was an enabler, opening doors for so many people and having a profound effect on the faith journeys of many people in the parish. He had a remarkable pastoral sensitivity, and many recall how he was able to communicate an understanding of a person's troubles by means of a simple gesture. He left an indelible mark on our parish community which we echo every Maundy Thursday as we read together the Prayer of Dedication which he composed for us.

Fr Patrick's funeral is to take place at Glasnevin Crematorium, Dublin on Monday 8 May at 2.30pm. We have not been notified if the funeral will be live-streamed, if a link is received we will notify parishioners.

Fr Patrick's family have asked that instead of flowers any donations can be made to Concern a charity that addresses specific causes of extreme poverty in communities and which Fr Patrick was keen to support: <u>https://www.concern.net/donate</u>

We will be having Evening Prayer/Vespers in our church on Sunday 7 May at 7.30pm and the church will remain open until 8.30pm for private prayer.

We will be celebrating a memorial Mass in memory and celebration of Fr Patrick's life here at SWOY on a date to be confirmed soon, followed by refreshments in the school hall. We will have a display of some photographs that reflect his time in our parish, if you have any photographs to share please let us know, and we will display them together with the ones from our parish archives.

Mass cards and letters for Fr Patrick's family may be handed to Fr Habte or posted through the presbytery door and we will forward them collectively.

TODAY'S READINGS -Acts 6:1-7, 1 Peter 2:4-9, John 14:1-12

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

As the festival of the Ascension approaches, Jesus begins to prepare his followers for his own departure from the world. There are two aspects to this teaching. Firstly Jesus speaks of the final purpose, union with the Father, and his preparation of a place for us there. He says that there is a 'room' for each of them, suggesting not that there are plenty of separate cubicles for different sets of people (bishops, babies, monks and maniacs), but that there is no lack of space in heaven. No problem of 'only one wins the prize' in this case. The second aspect is preparation for the future Church on earth, and the almost shocking promise that in the absence of Jesus – but in the strength of his Spirit – his people will do 'even greater works'. Paul teaches that believers 'make up what is lacking in the sufferings of Christ', for in every age the Church fills up the measure of Christ's sufferings; it is a Church which shares its Master's trials. In the same way in every age the Church must carry on the works of Christ. In John the 'works' of Jesus are the marvellous deeds, beyond mere human powers, which show who Jesus is. We too are called on to perform marvellous deeds, beyond mere human powers, works of grace and generosity. What is the real joy and excitement of heaven? How may we best carry on the 'work' of Christ? Dom Henry Wansbrough OSB
