God Bless Fr Habte TODAY'S READINGS - 2 Samuel 7:1-5,8-12,14,16, Romans 16:25-27, Luke 1:26-38

**SCRIPTURE REFLECTION** - At the start of today's Gospel reading we see a young Mary deeply disturbed by the Angel Gabriel's greeting and foretelling what she would expect in the future, including the birth of a baby boy even though she was still a virgin and unmarried.

What seemed to settle her fears was the news that her elderly kinswoman, Elizabeth, previously barren, was in the sixth month of a pregnancy. This was strengthened by the Angel making it clear that "nothing is impossible to God." Finally, Mary declares herself to be "The handmaid of the Lord" and is ready to accept whatever was to happen in her life.

The incident offers us the chance to renew our faith in God and be confident no matter what may befall us during our lives here on Earth. Our faith should help us to strengthen our ability to live our lives according to the Gospel and remember that Mary is always there to help us to make the right choices.

We only have to ask.

**NEXT SUNDAY'S READINGS -** Genesis 15:1-6,21:1-3, Hebrews 11:8-11-12,17-19, Luke 2:22-40

**NEXT SUNDAY'S SCRIPTURE REFLECTION** - Joseph and Mary take the infant Jesus to the temple in Jerusalem, in accordance with the law of Moses that first born males should be consecrated to the Lord. There they encounter Simeon, who is full of the Holy Spirit and has been told by God that he would live to see the Christ (the anointed one) of the Lord. Simeon blesses God and declares that Jesus is the salvation of all nations and a light to enlighten the pagans; he prophesies that Jesus will be a rejected sign and that Mary will suffer because of that rejection. They are joined by the prophetess, Anna, who praises God for the presence of the child Jesus. Joseph and Mary are amazed by these declarations, but then return to mundane family life in Nazareth, where it must have been hard to imagine how such prophesies could be fulfilled. Jesus grows up as the carpenter's son, filled with the wisdom of God.

When parents see their infant children baptised, they can only guess what sort of people they might become; but through that baptism, and through the example of their own lives, they pass on the light of Christ, so vividly described by Simeon. Whatever lies ahead, the baptised walk with a loving saviour, who was once a helpless baby. He truly shares their joys and trials and, ultimately, offers salvation through his own life, death, and resurrection.

Veronica, pictured below, was a parishioner of St William of York during the late 1980's and 1990's who may have been known to many of you. Veronica lived on Ravensbourne Crescent for about 7 years and then moved to Rushey Green. She walked to church virtually every day. Her daughter Sue had her wedding service at the church celebrated by the priests at the time Father Patrick Aikens and Father Alan McLean.

Friendly to everyone, she loved to have a chat and a laugh with so many of us. She was active in the Irish community in Lewisham and Greenwich, was a devoted supporter of the Columban Fathers and Sisters, like her mother before her, and was a volunteer at St Saviours helping out with the soup runs for the homeless down at the Embankment.

She moved to Burrell Mead Residential Home a few months ago, and benefited from the love and care of her family and the staff as well as continued contact from Fr Steve and Fr Ashley the priests at St Edmunds.

Veronica died on 6th December, her family by her side, three weeks after her last, cherished visit to St Edmund's.

Her requiem will be at St Edmunds on Weds 10th January at 11.45 am, and all who wish to attend are warmly invited to join in her farewell.
