EASTER SUNDAY'S READINGS -

Acts 19:34,37-43, Colossians 3:1-4, John 20:1-9

EASTER SUNDAY'S SCRIPTURE REFLECTION -

Jesus inspired his followers with new values and a new way of understanding their faith and God's kingdom. So it must have been devastating for his close followers to then see him humiliated, tortured and brutally killed. They'd lost the teacher they'd loved who had changed their lives.

The different accounts of the resurrection describe the women discovering his empty tomb. Initially terrified, they go on to tell the closest disciples what they had observed. Their despair turns into joy as they work out together that Jesus has risen. Their encounters with the risen Jesus in the following days help to rebuild their faith and give them the confidence to continue to spread what they now understand better as the Good News.

As we celebrate Jesus' resurrection, we celebrate God's unstoppable generous love for all, that even transcends death. Jesus' death and resurrection make it clear that God wants to forgive us, to raise us up and enable us to live life to the full. Let's use our joy and faith in God's eternal love to bring light, hope and generosity to those we meet and to the challenges of our world. Nothing can separate us from the love of God. Alleluia!

SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER SCRIPTURE REFLECTION - Today's Gospel is the conclusion of St John's Gospel, the story of God's revelation. Having started with the announcement that the Word is God, it concludes with Thomas' recognition that Jesus is "my Lord and my God".

Poor Thomas had sometimes got a bad press. But it's unfair to think of him as doubting Thomas. He is a disciple desperate to experience the resurrection in the world - not as a ghostly theological theory but a physical truth that transforms what he experiences in the world. Today's Gospel invites us to follow his example and seek and celebrate the material and physical experience of the resurrection in our twenty first century world.

The wounds of Christ in the world today - the suffering of individuals and communities - aren't to be dodged in our season of Easter joy. They are still real. Like Thomas we are invited by Christ to touch them. But as Christians, an Easter people, we now recognise that these wounds aren't the end of the story, there is hope. And these wounds can be healed through the power of the resurrection, can be transformed by love which has the power to undo oppression and bring back to the fullness of life all who live in sadness.

As we see this transforming love at work, we are challenged to recognise it as the power of the resurrection of Jesus, our Lord and our God.
