

TODAY'S READINGS - Acts 10:34,37-43, Colossians 3:1-4, John 20:1-9

EASTER SUNDAY SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

The Easter Gospels are full of breathless excitement - races to the tomb, misunderstandings and confusion as the glorious truth of Easter is slowly grasped. But at the heart of the Easter story in all four Gospels is the testimony of the women who discover the empty tomb. This is extraordinary - in first-century Jewish society women could be legal witnesses. In John's Gospel it is Mary of Magdala visits the tomb. She is the first witness of the Resurrection and announces the news to the apostles becoming the "Apostle to the Apostles". The primary testimony to the most important event is human history is a woman, not even allowed by her society to bear legal witness. On Easter Day the Gospel challenges us to listen to marginalised voices in our own society. They proclaim to us the truth of our Living God today. The poor and excluded are closest to His heart. If we hear Him in their voices and see Him in their faces we embrace our Risen Lord and claim the abundant life that Easter Day promises.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY, SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

This passage from John's Gospel has all the more significance because it brings the Gospel to a close. The story of the breakfast-party with the Risen Christ on the shore of the Lake of Galilee is a sort of appendix. The story-line of the main Gospel ends with Thomas blurting out 'My Lord and my God'. The Gospel therefore ends as it began, with the only two unmistakable declarations in the New Testament of the divinity of Jesus. 'The Word was God' and 'My Lord and my God' bracket the Gospel, indicating the purpose and angle of the whole Gospel which is to show that Jesus is God. John's Gospel complements the other Gospels: they show a man who is also God, whereas this Gospel shows God who is also a man. It is with the divine authority that Jesus confers on his Church the divine power to forgive. Real forgiveness is indeed Godlike. It is not simply 'forgive-and-forget', but forgiveness in the knowledge that a hurt has occurred. Just as a bone, broken and merged together again, can be stronger than it

was before it was broken, so forgiveness can create a real link of love on both sides, a treasured secret of divine graciousness between forgiver and forgiven. How have you experienced real forgiveness in your life?
