SCHOOL & PARISH PENITENTIAL SERVICE IN LENT

On Friday 24th March, at 1:45pm, we will have our School reconciliation service for our children, parents and parishioners are welcome to receive the sacrament after the children. Also, on Friday 31 March at 7:30pm we will have our parish penitential service. All are welcome.

RCIA/JOURNEY IN FAITH

On the 3rd, 4th, and 5th, Sunday of Lent we will be having a Scrutiny for Tabitha, now one of the elect, who is preparing for the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist supported by her Godparent Sudha. Each Scrutiny will be celebrated at a different Mass time each week.



The Scrutinies are a vital part of the process of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults known as the RCIA and occur during the period of Lent.

They are Rites of self-searching and repentance and have above all a spiritual purpose. The Scrutinies are meant to heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect; to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong and good.

The Scrutinies are celebrated to protect the elect against temptation and to give them strength in Christ who is the Way the Truth and the Life.

These Rites, therefore, should complete the conversion of the elect and deepen their resolve to hold fast to Christ and carry out their decision to love God above all.

TAKING THE HOLY SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION TO THE SICK AND HOUSEBOUND

On the first Sunday of every month (after 9.30 Mass) Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist visit those in our parish who are unable, through health or disability issues, to attend Mass but wish to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion. The Ministers take Holy Communion to them and offer it with a short service that can be built around the capacity of the person being visited. This can be done for someone who may be recovering from an injury and/or an operation or indeed someone who has a long-term condition.

Please contact Fr. Habte if you have a family member, friend or neighbour or know of anyone else who would like to receive Holy Communion at home once a month.

LENTEN ALMS

Almsgiving is one of the three pillars of our Lenten practice. Almsgiving is charity towards our neighbour. The parish is thankful for your donations during Lent and the money you place in the Poor Boxes near the Church entrances. The Lenten collection on Maundy Thursday, will be going in support of the Parish Crisis fund.

Please scan the QR code with your phone camera to access the secure Dona online portal or access via our website www.swoy.org.uk or use the contactless device facility in the Narthex to make a donation and sign up to Gift Aid or if your prefer collect a leaflet and pledge gift aid form from the Narthex and email or post back to the parish office. Since the installation of the contactless device in April 22 an additional 70 parishioners have signed up for gift aid which is great news as previously it was perhaps a maximum of 4 - 6 per year.
