

TODAY'S READINGS - Acts 1:12-14, 1 Peter 4:13-16, John 17:1-11

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION -

This Sunday we are in a wonderful place, between the celebration of the Ascension last Thursday and the overwhelmingly experience of the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, next Sunday. We are celebrating the glorification of Christ through his resurrection and praying for the coming of the Spirit. And the glory of Christ is the theme of today's Gospel.

The Gospel passage is taken from Jesus' prayer at the last supper in John's Gospel, from the night before he died. It is a prayer from the most intense evening of Jesus' life. What is extraordinary is that at the heart of his prayer to his Father that night is prayer for his followers, his disciples. We, Jesus' followers on earth, are at the heart of the prayer between the Son and the Father. The prayer that Christ prayed at the first Eucharist and now prays eternally in Heaven has his disciples as its intention.

This loving prayer assures us that we are supremely loved by God. However lonely, miserable, unworthy we feel, we are carried forever in the heart of God. The ascended Christ continues to pray for us today. The Gospel reminds us that this is why we share in the resurrection glory of Christ and this is why the Spirit is poured out on us, the people of God.
