Dear Parishioners

A few weeks ago, I spoke about the beauty and the place of singing within our liturgy, singing brings us closer to God and others. It encourages the participation of the faithful to be united in prayer.

The church teaches that, In the liturgy, music and singing are "a necessary and integral part or element of our liturgy", and almost indispensable; singing, above all, does not have a "filling" or "decorative" task, only to create the climate or atmosphere, or to "decorate or make the liturgy attractive. We sing to celebrate, to praise and glorify God for all the good he has done for us.

"The musical tradition of the universal Church is a treasure of inestimable value, greater even than that of any other art. The main reason for this pre-eminence is that, as sacred song united to the words, it forms a necessary or integral part of the solemn liturgy". Sacrosantum Concilium 112,

Here in our parish there is a strong tradition of singing in our liturgy, thanks to generations of priests and parishioners who worked hard over the years, giving generously their time and talent to create a parish music group. Through their hard work they have given Music and singing the place that it deserves within our liturgy.

Therefore, I encourage you to do two things, to actively join the faithful in singing during our liturgy and if you have the time to dedicate, to please join the parish music group, (you do not need an exceptional voice to join) and if you have the musical talent to join the parish instrumentalists.

TODAY'S READINGS -

Wisdom 6:12-16, ! Thessalonians 4:13-18, Matthew 25:1-13,

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION - Of course they weren't bridesmaids! According to the custom of the time the girls were attendant on the bridegroom, to greet him with their lamps as he arrived at the wedding-reception. Anyway, half of them weren't ready, let him down, and then found themselves shut out. There is a subtle difference between the parables given in Mark's and Matthew's gospels. In Mark they are all about the sudden coming of God's Kingship in history, at the time of Jesus. Jesus proclaimed that the crisis was now. In him God's reign had arrived: it was time to take drastic action. Matthew's parables take a longer-term view: there will be a final judgment at the end of time, for which we, in the Church and in the course of history, must prepare. Some will and some won't. Some will be found to be wheat, others to be weeds. When the catch of fish comes in, some fish will be thrown away, some kept. Some will be sheep and others goats. Each year, as the liturgical year draws to a close, the Church reminds us of this. And the End will be sudden and unpredictable, like a burglar on the one night I forgot to lock the door, or like a mouse-trap snapping shut, or like the unpredictable moment of birth pangs. Am I ready for the coming of Christ? What does it mean to be like the wise bridesmaids and have oil in my lamp? Dom Henry Wansbrough OSB


