TODAY'S READINGS - Malachi 1:14-2:2,8-10, ! Thessalonians 2:7-9,13, Matthew 23:1-12

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION - In today's Gospel Jesus explain to his followers that none of them can take title or place of God, especially those who lead our Christian communities. Like Jesus, we are called to serve others with love, not to rule others with condemnations as the Pharisees did.

Reading these words the week after the Synod in Rome has finished, it's hard not to be reminded of the example of Pope Francis. The Pope didn't sit on a throne but spent the weeks of the Synod sitting and listening to men and women, the people of God, at round tables. In the second reading St Paul tells us about his own experience of leading a Christian community "like a mother feeding and looking after her children, we felt so devoted and protective towards you...that we were eager to hand over not just the Good news but our whole life as well". St Paul's words and Pope Francis' example are responses to Jesus' call in today's Gospel for his followers to show that leadership in the Christian community is loving service.

Jesus' words about Christian leadership are not just for popes and bishops, priests and deacons, they are for all of us. Through our shared baptism we are all equally called to witness to our faith. We must fulfil this vocation in the world and in the church by serving and loving. None of us can put ourselves first but must stand aside in love to our sisters and brothers, serving our community. This way we will be building a community of love, service and justice, we will be building the Kingdom of God.
