TODAY'S READINGS - Ecclesiasticus 27:33-28:9, Romans 14:7-9, Matthew 18:21-35

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION -

There are so many characters to empathise with in this Sunday's Gospel. With Peter, because it is a challenge to truly forgive someone many times. With the servant, who begs the King for time to put things right. With the powerless man, who owed little, but was treated with no compassion. With the distressed servants, who saw the injustice of the King's wholehearted forgiveness not being paid forward. We can see ourselves in them all. Yet it is comforting to know that the God who asks us to keep forgiving, is also the God who is willing to forgive us. Jesus tells this story to help us understand that God asks us to forgive generously. We can choose to put things right, to make amends and to grow in compassion and rebuild relationships. And doing this takes time and emotional energy. Like Peter we may sometimes find forgiveness hard, but our first reading reminds us that carrying anger and resentment can be harmful too. Forgiveness can set us and others free. Is there someone to whom we could show more compassion?

15 years. Citizens UK is an alliance of local communities St William of York have been members of Citizens UK for over working together for social justice and the common good.

They bring together everyday people and local organisations to build a better, fairer society, listening and discussing changes members want to see in their community. For example, issues such as immigration, the living wage and affordable housing. St Williams of York Citizens together with London Community Land Trust recently completed a project and successfully delivered 11 affordable homes in Citizens House, Unity Way, Sydenham. The project which began in 2014 has received positive press coverage in a number of national newspapers and specialist architectural journals. In May the project won a highly coveted Pineapple Award for Community Engagement.

Building on this excellent work we would like to invite the parish to participate in another listening campaign, to find out what issues are important to us and from there create a St William of York Citizens group who will represent our views on the Lewisham and Greenwich Citizens alliance. The Listening Campaign will take place on 14/15 October after each mass.


