TODAY'S READINGS - Acts 9:26-31, 1 John 3:18-24, John 15:1-8

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION - Jesus gives us a picture of himself as the true vine, God the Father as the gardener nurturing the vine, and we, his disciples, are the branches providing the grapes, the fruit of the vine.

The fruit we produce is through revealing God's Will, which is Love. We are privileged that God wants to work in us and through us; we know He loves us and that He wants us to reveal His Love to others. We are only able to produce such fruit because we rely on the teaching of Jesus, founded in the love of God for each one of us. As branches, we cannot bear fruit if we cut ourselves off from Jesus; we cannot rely on ourselves without God nurturing our faith.

The analogy is carried further. Every gardener knows that branches produce some shoots which serve no purpose and should be cut off, because they sap the energy of the plant. In the same way, God prunes back our vain efforts to achieve our own ends, so that all our energy is devoted to producing the fruit of God's Love.

When we seek to do God's Will with sincerity and humility, our prayers are answered and our efforts bear fruit.
