SCRIPTURE REFLECTION -

Jesus' earthly mission is nearing its end. In the intervening time since last week's Gospel, in response to remarks made by His disciples, He has been depicting, in very graphic terms to them, the signs which will accompany the ending of time, the conclusion of all things.

This is all appropriate to the time in which we are now in the Church's Liturgical year: its conclusion. Next Sunday we will celebrate the Feast of Christ the King, bringing our liturgical journey with Jesus to its climax. In today's Gospel Jesus assures us of His return "in glory, with great power", yes, as Lord of all, but, as Jesus self-designates Himself, as the Son of Man. This was Jesus' preferred title for Himself in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke, emphasising His common humanity with us all. As He was seen to ascend bodily to heaven "in a cloud", so will He return, "coming in the clouds," the same Jesus, "in the same way, as His disciples saw Him go". (Acts 1:9)
